




Landscape Update

As some of you have noticed some of the lawn looks darker in certain areas. This was a mistake by the landscaping team in that one of their men accidentally left the guard on to the fertilizer spreader as they fertilized.

The good news is the landscaping team has already begun re-fertilizing the areas in which this happened. **President Justin** Allen and the Landscaping Committee has been pressing the landscaping crew to get answers to the creeping indigo and other invasive weeds that are beginning/ continuing to grow in our lawns. The landscaping team should be addressing these weeds soon, however the herbicide

takes 2-4 weeks to kill off the weeds. Additionally, we have asked the landscaping crew to give us priority bed remediation projects (based on their expertise) and are aiming to begin special projects to restore beds that were destroyed by bore, el toro grass invasion, or other unforeseen circumstances. On a positive note the front end special project is now 100% completed. We have approved for seven trees to have root remediation (pictured) and mulch put around the bases of the trees. We tested this out on seven (7) trees and if we see positive impacts we will aim to do the same with other trees around Kamalani Property. On the recommendation of tree arborist's climbingHi, we have begun pulling the bands off of some of the trees. These bands were only meant to be on the trees for 1-2 years. The trees must

blow in the wind to develop a strong trunk. We have started with trees that are not close to any buildings and/or cars. The landscaping team may only loosen bands that pose a hazard to cars if they were to fall. Any questions or concerns regarding landscaping should be sent to Site Manager Sean.
